Manager and Coaches Code of Conduct 2025

As a manager or coach, it is crucial to maintain adult-like conduct during coaching sessions and prioritize the best interests of every ball player and West El Paso Baseball (WEPB). To meet these responsibilities satisfactorily, each manager and coach is expected to:

- Know the rules and abide by them.
- It's important to properly instruct team members about the rules and regulations of the game.
 Additionally, as a coach, it's crucial to motivate each player to always compete by the rules.
 This not only ensures a fair and safe game for everyone involved but also helps instill good sportsmanship values in the players.
- Ensure the health and safety of all players, including by adhering to all pitch count rules, and in the absence of rules, act in the best interest of player health and longevity regardless of the situation.
- At all times to protect the principles of fun, safety, and development of all athletes.
- Respect the umpires and refrain from questioning their decisions in a disrespectful or abusive manner.
- Ensure that the players and spectators follow the game and practice facility rules and regulations.
- Ensure that fans of his team always conduct themselves with sportsmanship and maturity
 while in attendance at game/practice sites; assist the umpires in maintaining control of
 spectators during the games.
- Respect the manager, coaches, players, and parents of the opposing team both during the game's play and at its conclusion, win or lose.
- Teach each player, especially through personal example, to be humble and generous in victory and proud and courteous in defeat.
- Maintain control of his/her emotions and avoid actions, language, and gestures that may be interpreted as hostile and humiliating. Foul or abusive language in the vicinity of players is not permitted.
- Refrain from the use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, or other illegal substances at games, practices, and all other WEPB team events.
- Instruct team support personnel (e.g., assistant coaches, scorekeepers, team parents) in their responsibilities by established rules.
- Realize, accept, and practice the principle that a team's reputation is built not only on its playing ability, but also on its sportsmanship, courtesy, and manner.
